The patterns of spacial and temporal distribution in the years 1998 through 2003 pertained this year as well.

Veeries tend to be identified far more frequently in the earlier series than in the later series. Sixteen Veeries have been seen in the earlier series, 3 in the later, and 2 in both. This is true of Least Flycatchers as well; all 6 have been identified during the earlier series. No other species show this pattern; none show the opposite pattern.
